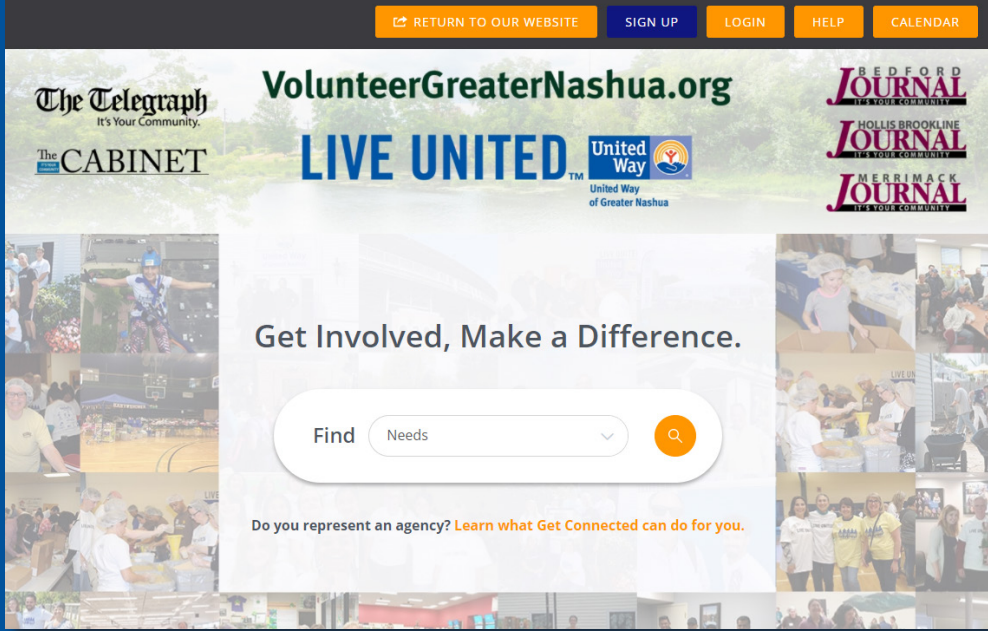
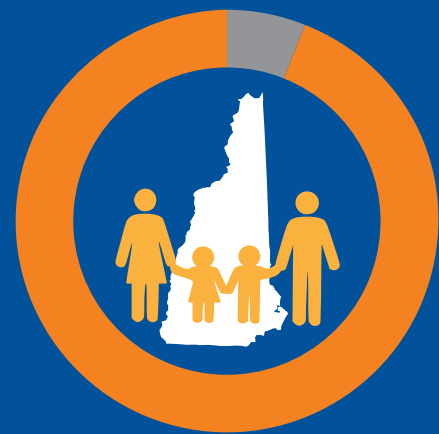


# Volunteer Greater Nashua – A useful new resource for volunteers and organizations

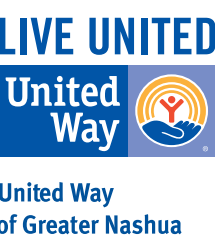

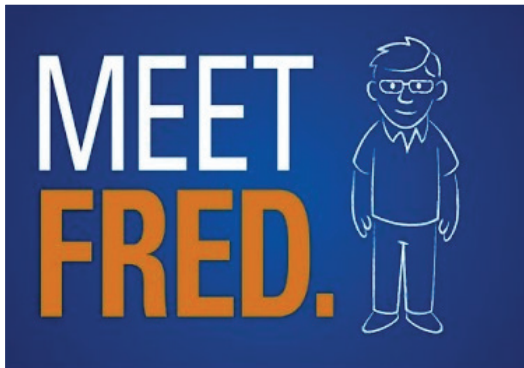

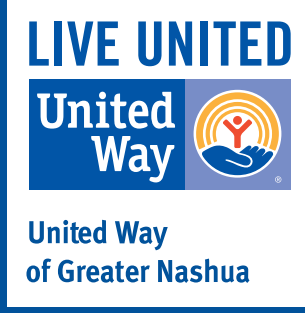

**\$1 a day will provide a security deposit for a family to transition from homelessness to permanent housing.**  
**\$1 a day will provide breakfast for one preschool child for a whole year.**  
**\$3 a day will buy an older or disabled adult a month of home delivered meals and safety check with each meal.**

**\$5 a week will feed 4 children 5 nights a week for a month.**  
**\$10 a week will provide 10 families with heat assistance.**  
**\$10 a week will allow a child impacted by substance abuse the opportunity to attend camp for week.**

**\$20 a week will provide 346 meals to children who do not have meals at home.**  
**\$20 a week will allow a dying patient to spend up to three days in hospice care .**

The entire greater Nashua community will gain access to wellness and preventative care; dental and behavioral health through a state-of the art RV-style mobile clinic.	
Early Intervention for Acting Out Preteens	The Youth Council (603-889-1090)
The go-to resource for families at their wits ends, with children that are disruptive at home, in school and causing problems within the community where coordinated counseling and other supports that improve family functioning and child success.	
Young Women's Leadership/Prevention Girls Inc. of NH	Girls Inc. of New Hampshire (603-882-6256)
Girls build self esteem and confidence to avoid high risk behaviors like substance misuse, bullying and violence, and early sexual activity.	
Forensic Interview Program	The Granite State Children's Alliance (800-894-5533)
Child victims of abuse or sexual assault are interviewed a single time, in a child-friendly setting by a specially trained interviewer where law enforcement, attorneys, protective services, advocacy agencies and health professionals can observe.
